A message from our CEO

Well Spring is here – what a relief to have Winter behind us. Some of you will be looking forward to a break at the end of the month while others will be planning holiday activities or just continuing to receive services as usual.

The NDIS is almost fully rolled out with 107 of our existing clients with approved plans. There are only 5 clients waiting on an NDIS plan that are yet to transition. Of the 107 NDIS customers, 78 have signed NDIS service agreements. Mostly the transition to NDIS has been a positive experience for PALS, with overwhelmingly good outcomes for most of our customers.

PALS is delighted to announce the appointment of Kate Wright to our team. Kate is the Support Coordinator for PALS and brings a wealth of knowledge to the role having previously worked in a similar role, supporting people with complex needs. Kate provides support coordination to NDIS participants – some of whom use PALS services and some who do not. We wish to take this opportunity to welcome Kate to PALS and to wish her every success in her new role.

PALS has developed a new Strategic Plan 2019 – 2024 to reflect the changing world we are now operating within. It will be presented at the AGM but we wish to thank everyone who contributed to the document – the customers by way of focus groups and interviews, the families for their participation in the survey, the staff for their contribution via '6 thinking hats', and the Board and the senior staff for their attendance at several workshops. We are proud of the document and hope we can achieve all that we have set for ourselves for the future.

The AGM is to be held at the Shamrock Hotel in Numurkah on the 30th October. I hope you have all received your invitations by now and we look forward to welcoming you on the night. Please RSVP your attendance to Taylor. The reports will be sent out prior to the AGM – we are just waiting on the Accountants to return the audited financials for printing.

Earlier this year PALS in conjunction with VALID (an advocacy group for people who live with a disability) delivered a 3-day workshop at the Cobram Barooga Golf Club for around 20 of our customers which was then followed up with another one-day workshop at the Numurkah Golf Club. Some of the topics covered were 'Staying Safe', 'Keys to Success' and 'Empowerment and Self Advocacy' training. From this work we have developed a PALS Advisory Committee made up of existing customers of PALS comprising around 12 people. This group met for the first-time last week with Bronwyn Stanley our Chair and I where we developed up the Terms of Reference. This group which will now meet monthly will report directly to the Board on their experiences as service users of PALS. We hope that this direct line of communication enables us to be more responsive to the services that you want to receive from PALS.

We are very sorry to report that two of our clients who have received services from PALS for many years are leaving PALS this week. Helen Milton who was one of the first clients to attend Cobram Gateway Services over 30 years ago and who has lived her entire life in Cobram is moving to live in Melbourne to be nearer her sister Leanne. Danielle Greaves who was a former client of Northern Disability Services is leaving the Numurkah O'Connor St service to attend other services nearer her home in Mooroopna. We wish both of the delightful young women all the very best with the changes to their lives. We shall miss them both. Enjoy your break those of you who are having them.
